# CONDITION OF PUNJAB GOVERNMENT SCHOOL LIBRARIES ESPECIALLY IN THE DISTRICTS OF MOHALI AND RUPNAGAR: AN OVERVIEW

The study presents the condition of Punjab government school libraries in Mohali and Rupnagar districts. School libraries are essential part for the overall development of students. Libraries are still in developing stage in some of the already developed government schools. The purpose of the school library is to provide self-education but the condition of government school libraries in Mohali and Rupnagar is not satisfactory. This paper examines the nature of staff, Physical facilities, Number of books and periodicals in libraries. It also discusses the library facilities and expenditure on Government schools libraries of Mohali and Rupnagar.

#### INTRODUCTION

Libraries are absolutely essential to achieve the developmental goals, improve quality of life and preserve and make known the cultural heritage [1]. Academic libraries are as varied and distinctive as the institutions which they serve [2]. Academic libraries comprise the libraries of schools, colleges and universities which cater to the needs of different levels of academic community and supplement academic instructions [3].

School libraries are primarily meant to collect and arrange syllabi based books and some books for general reading and entertainment that may include classics, biographies, adventure and travel books, fiction, etc. [4]. Cultivating lifelong reading habits and opening of windows of knowledge to the students are the main objectives of school libraries [5]. To achieve these main objectives, they have to build up their collections with print and non-print information sources, and act as media centres [6]. They have to serve the students and teachers with a number of services like reference, storytelling, debates, film shows, book reading clubs, etc. The school libraries have still a greater role where there are no public libraries, as they have to perform the role of public library also. As their collections may include multimedia documents they are often referred to as "media centres" also [7]. But if Government school libraries are without proper library budget, efficient and trained librarians then it is just because of lack of farsightedness on the part of educational authorities. It is a common scene in Punjab especially in Mohali and Rupnagar districts. Government School libraries are without adequate library budget, efficient and trained staff and proper space and building. These are generally housed in are mote corner of the school building where books are kept under lock and key and where do not find proper reading material and place to study. To make library a central point of a school, it is necessary that these are provided a right place, proper furniture and relevant reading material [8].

#### **OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY**

The following are the objectives of this study:

- To know whether or not the school libraries of Mohali and Rupnagar districts are managed by trained librarians.
- To study the physical facilities in the school libraries of Mohali and Rupnagar districts.
- To know the number of books, magazines, newspapers and other types of reading materials.
- To study the system of technical processing in school libraries.
- To know the system of circulation of books in these libraries.
- To know the average number of books issued and returned per day.
- To know the average number of readers visited per day.
- To study the budgets of school libraries for their maintenance and improvement.

### **METHODOLOGY**

Keeping the above-cited objectives in view, the research plan was drawn, and to collect comprehensive and relevant data, a questionnaire is used as a tool. Author visited all the school libraries to collect the original and reliable data and also met the librarians/teacher in-charge of the schools. From there author came to know the exact situation of school libraries. The author also discussed with the school pupils to understand the difficulties that they are found in their school library. By observation author checked each and every aspect of libraries such as financial problem, reading room and materials present in the libraries.

#### ANALYSIS OF DATA

A survey was conducted through structured questionnaire circulated personally among the fourteen school librarians of Mohali and Rupnagar districts. All filled the questionnaires and these were collected personally so the response rate is 100 percent.

### **Availability of Trained Librarians**

Table 1 shows the availability of trained librarians in different government school libraries. It is clear from table that out of fourteen schools only five schools (i.e. Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School, Phase-3B2, Mohali; Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Chunni, Mohali; Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Sohana, Mohali; GMN Sr. Sec. School, Rupnagar and Govt. Sr. Sec. School for Girls, Rupnagar) have trained librarians.

# **Physical Facilities**

Table 2 shows that out of fourteen only three schools (i.e. Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School, Phase-3B2, Mohali; Govt. Elementary School, Majatri, Mohali and GMN Sr. Sec. School, Rupnagar) provided specific rooms for libraries, they are airy and ventilated and also mottos are written on the walls. All other government schools have not even provided separate rooms for housing the library.

Table 3 shows the collection development in Government school libraries of Mohali and Rupnagar districts, during the last three years. It is clear from the table that in Govt. Schools, minimum

numbers of books (220) were purchased in Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Lakhnour, Mohali and maximum numbers of books (700) were purchased in Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School, Phase-3B2, Mohali.

# **Library Services**

From the table 5, it is clear that three out of fourteen govt. schools i.e. Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School, Phase-3B2, Mohali, Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Jhanjeri, Mohali and Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Lakhnour, Mohali have done technical processing of books. Also all govt. schools provide issue/return facility to its readers, out of which two schools, i.e. Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School, Phase-3B2, Mohali and GMN Sr. Sec. School, Rupnagar use computerized

method and others use manual method. It is also clear that only five govt. schools provide book bank facility and four schools provide books to the community.

So, we can say that there is a need for technical processing of books in govt. schools, so that the books can be found out easily by the students as well as by the teachers.

# Money spent on Government school libraries

Table 7 shows the expenditure spent by the libraries of govt. schools on books and periodicals. It is clear from the table that in govt. schools, the expenditure on books and periodicals is either decreasing in the coming years or remains the same with the only exception, i.e. Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School, Phase-3B2, Mohali in which expenditure on books is increasing from Rs.30,000 (2013-14) to Rs.45,000 (2015-16).

School libraries should have an open shelf system so that students get free access to books and learn how to handle them. There should be full co-operation between students and librarians. School librarians who do not have library background should be given a summer course training of 3-4 weeks duration. We have to understand the fact that school library is an essential instrument of education [9]. This paper shows the condition of government school libraries and educational authorities have to work on this so that the condition of libraries may improve.
